

Cassowary Coast Regional Council Subordinate Local Law No. 3 (Community and Environment) 2022

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Part 1 Preliminary

(1) Short title

This subordinate local law may be cited as *Subordinate Local Law No.* 3 (Community and Environment) 2022.

(2) Purpose

The purpose of this subordinate local law is to support *Local Law No.* 3 *(Community and Environment)* 2022 by providing schedules that must be read in conjunction with the local law:

- (a) declaring animals or plants of specified species to be local pests;
- (b) exempting certain persons in relation to declared pests;
- (c) prohibiting lighting and maintaining of fires;
- (d) prescribing requirements relating to community safety hazards; and
- (e) prescribing noise standards.

(3) Authorising local law

The making of the provisions in this subordinate local law is authorised by *Local Law No. 3 (Community and Environment) 2022* (the **authorising local law**).

	(b) causes an unreasonable annoyance or distress;			
	(c) is injurious or prejudicial to health;			
	 (d) persistently occurs or continues to such a degree or extent that it unreasonably interferes with the peace, comfort or social well-being of a reasonable person; or 			
	 (e) disrupts or inhibits an activity ordinarily carried out on adjoining or nearby residential premises. 			
	In addition, for an incinerator and a fire outside of a fireplace:			
	(f) it must not be within 100 metres of a residence.			
(2) All local government controlled areas	A fire that is not in a fireplace or barbecue constructed by the local government, or other place specifically provided or set apart by the local government for fires.
