Applicants are subject to eligibility criteria and must complete the relevant application through Council's Smarty Grants portal with all supporting documentation in order for the application to be considered.

Council provides Community Grants and Support to respond to community priorities and need; to create a more sustainable and resilient community by delivering social (including health and wellbeing), cultural, environmental and economic outcomes through the funding streams.

Projects and initiatives selected will align with Council's Vision - We aspire to provide great experiences, deliver value and create a sustainable future for our community.

Objectives of the Cassowary Coast Regional Council Community Grants and Support Program:

- Create opportunities for diverse activities and events to meet identified community priorities that align with Council's vision and strategic objectives in accordance with <u>Council's 2021-</u> 2025 Corporate Plan.
- Build community skills, capacity and resilience.
- Develop and maintain community infrastructure.
- Strengthen our community through social inclusion and collaboration.
- Form collaborative partnerships to prioritise physical and mental wellbeing of residents.
- Prioritise the natural environment.

In accordance with Council's Community Grants and Support Policy, the local government principles prescribed in the Local Government Act 2009 (Qld) apply to Council's Community Grants and Support Program.

- For Program Funding Streams with more than 1 funding round per annum, if Round 1 is under-subscribed, the remaining funds will roll-over to Round 2 within a financial year.
- Council can allocate any unexpended funds in a Program Funding Stream to another Program Funding Stream if appropriate and if other Streams are over-subscribed in the final grant rounds for the financial year.
- Program Funding Streams that have ongoing applications throughout the financial year will be open until all funds are expended with no further funds available in the 2023-2024 financial year.
- Timing of the opening and closing dates of Funding Streams may vary from time to time in response to operational requirements.
- Other Program Funding Streams may be added through the financial year.

Eligibility

All individuals or groups applying for Community Grants and Support must comply with the specific requirements of the funding stream that they are applying for. The intention of the Community Grants and Support Program is to support small scale, community projects and individual endeavours. Those seeking funding outside of this Program should contact Council to discuss other options.

Eligible organisations:

- Be a legal not for profit organisation or registered charity (including Parents and Citizens and Parents and Friends Associations) or be auspiced by an incorporated not for profit organisation, complying with all legislative requirements at the time of making application to the Program. Auspice organisations accept legal and financial responsibility for the project/initiative the organisation is making application for.
- Operating within Cassowary Coast Local Government Area or delivering a project/initiative within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.
- The majority of members residing in the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.
- Have no outstanding debts with the Cassowary Coast Regional Council and be financially viable.
- Have no outstanding grant acquittals for any previous Grants or Program Support from Council unless through an Auspice arrangement.
- Have a bank account in the name of the legal entity making application to the Program.
- Have the necessary insurances including public liability.
- Ability to obtain appropriate permits for the project/initiative the organisation is making application for.
- Meet the eligibility criteria of the Program Funding Stream.

Ineligible Organisations:

- Local, state or federal government departments, organisations and agencies
- Private and public educational organisations (excluding Parents and Citizens and Parents and Friends Associations)
- Religious, political or discriminatory organisations
- Unions and student guilds
- Research foundations and trusts
- Professional associations
- For profit entities
- Organisations that have not satisfactorily acquitted previous Council grants or funding support
- Do not meet the eligibility criteria of the Program Funding Stream

Eligible Individuals:

- Must reside within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area
- Must meet the eligibility criteria of the Program Funding Stream

Ineligible Individuals:

- Reside outside of the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area
- Do not meet the eligibility criteria of the Program Funding Stream

Ineligible Items (unless otherwise specified in the Program Funding Stream):


- Items or projects that are the core business or responsibility of a government department
- Retrospective funding, that is, projects or initiatives that have already started or are completed
- Recurrent and operational expenses such as wages, rent, insurance, telephone, clothing,

uniforms (except for the Get Active Program Stream), relocation costs etc.

- Promotional items or merchandise
- Prize money, raffle prizes or fundraising activities
- Debt or loan repayments
- Grant writer fees and associated costs
- Alcohol
- Contingency costs
- Auspice or project management fees
- Projects or initiatives that have a commercial purpose
- Projects or initiatives that do not meet applicable legislative requirements
- Projects or initiatives that have received funding through Council sponsorship or other support arrangements
- Projects or initiatives that do not involve the Cassowary Coast Community

Ineligible applications:

- Applications that are incomplete including not providing all requested supporting documentation in accordance with Program Funding Stream Guidelines.
- Applications that do not comply with the Community Grants and Support Policy and/or the Eligibility Criteria and Guidelines of the Program Funding Stream.
- Applications that are made by an ineligible organisation or individual.
- Applications that do not prioritise local suppliers unless the goods or services are not able to be sourced within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.
- Applications that are from an organisation that has already received funding in the current financial year through the Community Grants and Support Program, unless the application is through Auspicing arrangements, or the applicant has received funding through the Community Infrastructure Program Stream.
- Applications that are not lodged through Council's Smarty Grants platform.



COMMUNITY AND ECONOMY PROGRAM STREAM

Aspirations

- We have a resilient economy leveraging opportunities through strategic partnerships and collaboration between all levels of government, community and industry.
- We meet the social, economic and environmental challenges of our region to provide longterm inclusive and sustainable socio-economic outcomes using a place-based, communityfirst approach.

Program Stream Criteria

- Provide inclusive and diverse events or activities for the region and engage marginalised or other priority groups.
- Increase participation in activities which increase physical activity and/or that target priority groups.
- Activities which support social or emotional well-being.
- Create strong, resilient communities and social networks.
- Support activation, events or place making.
- Increase and diversify employment opportunities and increase economic diversification.
- Support new or existing tourism events.
- Increase visitor spending and exposure for the region.
- Promote collaboration between businesses.
- Grow local supply chains, local food production and/or processing capacity.
- Fill gaps in product and service delivery, support niche markets.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM STREAM

Our Aspirations

Council is partnering with First Nations' elders, sustainability leaders, local businesses and community members to help preserve and regenerate the region's unique biodiversity within the UNESCO World Heritage areas of the Wet Tropics and Great Barrier Reef, our coastline, rain forests, waterways and other natural environments for current and future generations.

Program Stream Criteria:

- Build capacity in sustainability practices.
- Support biodiversity, increase knowledge of local flora and fauna.
- Increase participation in community environmental or conservation activities or projects.
- Support the implementation of sustainable practices for the community.
- Focus on environmental education and implementation of grass roots initiatives.
- Encourage re-use, reduce and recycling and diversion of waste from landfill.
- Essential equipment and/or training for wildlife carers.
- Support the reduction of energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions.

- Community gardens
- Eco-events
- Waste awareness and reduction initiatives
- Native beekeeping
- Environmental monitoring

- Minor applications are not required to demonstrate a co-contribution to the project or initiative
- Major applications are required to demonstrate a 10% co-contribution to the project which can be in-kind and/or financial.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM STREAM

Our Aspirations

We are enjoying sustainable and responsible growth and development, with plans being actioned to deliver sufficient infrastructure, housing and community facilities, and safe, well-connected places and spaces that support and enhance quality of life for our community.

Program Stream Criteria:

- Projects must develop, renew, enhance or improve community facilities that deliver public benefit and quality outcomes for the Cassowary Coast community.
- Applicants must hold a lease or licence or an ongoing and current agreement over the land or own the building and/or land.
- Applicants must provide evidence of any permissions needed including planning and building approvals and this can include pre-lodgement discussions with Council.
- Applicants must not have any outstanding maintenance works or rectification notices.
- Applicants must have written approval from the owner (lessor) if required.
- If a Community Infrastructure Project Funding Round is over-subscribed, preference will be given to organisations who have been awarded co-funding for the project from sources other than Cassowary Coast Regional Council (e.g. State or Federal Funding, Philanthropic Foundation).
- Successful applicants under the Community Infrastructure Program Stream are eligible to apply for other Funding Streams within the Community Grants and Support Program with the relevant criteria applicable.

Examples:

- Upgrades or refurbishments to existing facilities.
- Fencing, grandstands, shade shelters or seating.
- Fit outs required for occupation or use.
- Sports-specific infrastructure such as lighting, goal posts, scoreboards.
- Permanent fixtures/improvements to a building such as air conditioning, solar panels, solar battery storage and awnings.

Available Funding:

- Program funding for the 2023-2024 financial year is \$100,000 with 1 funding round
 - o Stream A Minor Community Infrastructure Program Funding is \$25,000
 - Stream B Major Community Infrastructure Program Funding is \$75,000
- Minor Community Infrastructure Projects maximum funding available per application is up to \$5,000.
- Minor Community Infrastructure Applications up to \$2,000 are not required to demonstrate a co-contribution to the project.
- Minor Community Infrastructure Applications from \$2,001 to \$5,000 are required to demonstrate a 10% co-contribution to the project which can be in-kind and/or financial.
- Major Community Infrastructure Projects applications must be from \$10,000 to \$30,000 per application.
- Major Community Infrastructure Applications are required to demonstrate a 20% cocontribution to the project which can be in-kind and/or financial. A minimum of the cocontribution must be 10% financial contribution.
- Minor applications request less detail than major applications.
- If a Community Facility Project Funding Round is over-subscribed, preference will be given to organisations who have been awarded co-funding for the project from sources (e.g. State or Federal Funding, Philanthropic Foundation) other than Cassowary Coast Regional Council.

SPORTS CLUBS AND ACTIVE RECREATION INSURANCE SUPPORT PROGRAM

Our Aspirations

Our Community is enjoying enhanced liveability with a strong sense of pride, belonging and connection, with improved access to quality health and wellbeing and community services.

The Program

The Sports Club and Active Recreation Insurance Support Program provides responsive funding support for public liability insurance for not for profit sports and active recreation clubs within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.

Program Stream Criteria:

- Applicants must be a local or regional level Queensland not for profit sport or active recreation organisation operating within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.
- Applicants must provide their certificate of currency or an insurance renewal notice for public liability payable or paid within the current financial year.
- Applications can be retrospective provided that the application is for insurance paid or payable within the current financial year.
- Eligible organisations may only submit one application per round of the Program.
- Organisations undertaking the sport or active recreation activities listed in Table One:
 Eligible Sport and Active Recreation Activities, are eligible to apply to this Program Stream.
- Applicants must have a membership of 20 or more active members.

Program Funding Categories:

- Program funding for the 2023-2024 financial year is \$6,000.
- The Sports Clubs and Active Recreation Insurance Support Program accepts ongoing applications of \$250.00 throughout the financial year until the budget is fully expended.
- Successful applicants under the Program are eligible to apply for other funding streams within the Community Grants and Support Program.

- Applicants must be a resident of the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area and 18 years of age and under
- Applicants must be representing the Cassowary Coast, a Northern Region or similar Zone,
 Queensland or Australia in an officially recognised STEAM or Sports event or competition
- The event must be amateur in status
- Applicants must provide a letter of selection or qualification to participate
- Applicants have a limit of one successful application per financial year

Program Stream Criteria:

To be eligible for Youth Sports Bursary, nominees must

- Be an Australian Citizen.
- Be a resident of the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area (when nominations close).
- Be in the correct age group as nominated on the first day of January of the year when nominations close.
- All applications must have a supporting referee, nominations will be considered for one category only.
- Not have won a 'Sports Star' award or Sports Bursary in the last five years.

When considering nominations put forward for this Bursary, nominees should show an outstanding achievement in sport, in a non-professional sporting field. Consideration will be given to how the Bursary will be used to further develop skills or open up opportunities for the nominee.

Receipt of this Bursary does not prevent application to other Funding Programs within Council's Community Grants and Support Program.

Bursary Funding

Bursary Recipients will receive a \$200 Award plus memorabilia (e.g. trophy/medallion, polo shirt, certificate or similar). Bursaries will not be required to be acquitted by recipients.

EMERGENT NEEDS (RAPID RESPONSE)

Our Aspirations

Our community is enjoying enhanced liveability with a strong sense of pride, belonging and connection, with improved access to quality health and wellbeing and community services.

The Program

The Emergent Needs Program provides rapid response and limited financial support for community groups and organisations to support expenses that are generally unforeseen when planning events, activities or initiatives.

Program Stream Criteria:

- Applicants must specify the Relevant Program Stream (Community and Economy or Environmental Sustainability) that they are making application under; and the activities, initiatives or events will need to meet the criteria within the relevant Program Stream, noting that the assessment criteria are to a lesser extent.
- Applicants cannot seek Emergent Needs funds under the Community Infrastructure Program Stream.
- Applicants must seek quotes from local businesses within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area, unless the goods or services are not locally available.
- For this Program Stream only Eligible Organisations is extended to include
 - o Private and public educational organisations
 - Research foundations and trusts
 - Professional or for-profit entities

Available Program Funding:

- Program funding for the 2023-2024 financial year is \$10,000.
- The Emergent Needs Program accepts ongoing applications up to \$1,000 throughout the financial year until the budget is fully expended.
- Organisations who have received funding from another Community Grants Stream are not eligible to make application to the Emergent Needs Program unless it is under auspicing arrangements for another group.

ANZAC DAY AND BATTLE OF THE CORAL SEA COMMEMORATIONS

Our Aspirations

Our community is enjoying enhanced liveability with a strong sense of pride, belonging and



connection, with improved access to quality health and wellbeing and community services.

The Program

The ANZAC Day and Battle of the Coral Sea Commemorations Program Stream provides funding for eligible applicants to support commemorative activities for ANZAC Day and the Battle of the Cora Sea within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.

Program Stream Criteria:

- Application for ANZAC Day Commemorations is only by invitation to RSL Sub Branches (Eligible Organisations) within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.
- Application for the Battle of the Coral Sea Commemorations is only by invitation to a
 community group or organisation that has, by long-standing custom and practice, been
 delivering the annual commemorations (Eligible Organisation) or to an RSL Sub Branch
 within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area.
- Applications must be for community activities that commemorate the service and sacrifice
 of Australia's service personnel in wars, conflicts and peace operations on ANZAC Day and
 the Battle of the Coral Sea Commemorations.
- Applicants must provide details of how the funds will be used for the commemorative activities, including quotes.
- Applicants must seek quotes from local businesses within the Cassowary Coast Local Government Area, unless the goods or services are not locally available.
- Quotes are not required for budget items less than \$500
- One (1) written quote is required from a local supplier where local suppliers exist for budget items over \$500 otherwise quotes will be accepted from non-local suppliers.
- Successful applicants under the ANZAC Day and Battle of the Coral Sea Commemoration Program Stream are eligible to apply for other Funding Streams within the Community Grants and Support Program with the relevant criteria applicable.

Available Program Funding:

- Program funding for the 2023-2024 financial year is \$16,000 with 1 funding round
- Stream A Cardwell and El Arish ANZAC Day Commemorations and Battle of the Coral Sea Commemorations maximum funding of \$2,000 per eligible organisation each financial year.
- Stream B Innisfail and Tully ANZAC Day commemorations maximum funding of \$5,000 per eligible organisation each financial year.
- Funding for each eligible organisation is in accordance with the eligible funding Stream
- Funding will only be made to eligible organisations that have received an invitation from Council to make application to the Program in a financial year.

Lodging an Application

Applicants must read guidelines thoroughly and ensure they have all the necessary documentation and information available prior to beginning. Ensure you keep a copy of your application for your records.

Applications must include a detailed budget and should seek out quotations for services to ensure financial costing is as accurate as possible. The budget should include evidence of organisational contribution, which may include cash and in-kind support in accordance with the Program Stream Guidelines.

Grant applications must be submitted online through Council's Smarty Grants platform. Community Development Officers can provide guidance and assistance with lodgement of applications. An eligible applicant may submit one application only each funding cycle. Applicants may apply in consecutive rounds only if previously secured funding has been fully acquitted and all other requirements have been met.

Council reserves the right to prioritise applicants who have not recently received funding. Those applicants applying for a RADF grant are not eligible to apply for a Community Grant within the same financial year. An Auspicing Organisation may auspice multiple organisations simultaneously provided there are no outstanding acquittals and the Auspicing Organisation can demonstrate they have the capacity to fulfill the Auspicing Arrangements.

	 Applications will be assessed by a panel generally comprising of Council officers, a Councillor and where possible with specialists relevant to the subject of the application.
Conditions of Grant	 All Community Grants and Support awarded is subject to specific conditions.

General Information For Applicants cont.

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Local supplier	 A Local Supplier is a supplier: (i) whose business is beneficially owned by persons who are residents and rate payers of the local government area of Council; or (ii) which has its principal place of business within the local government area of Council; or (iii) otherwise has a place of business within the local government area of Council which solely or primarily employs persons who are residents or rate payers of the local government area of Council.
Conflict of interest	 All officers or Councillors are responsible for recognising and declaring any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest. This may include, but is not limited to, personal connections with the applicant. Anyone having a determined conflict of interest should not debate or be involved in any discussions on any matter relating to the specific applicant.
Terms and conditions	 Any funds remitted are to be used for the approved purpose described in the application. Reallocation of funds is not permitted unless authorised by Cassowary Coast Regional Council. Any variation to the funding terms and conditions must be made in writing to Council and it is at the discretion of Council to approve the variation request.
