





Keeping of Animals

Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2022 Subordinate Local Law No. 2 (Animal Management) 2022

Definitions

Animal: Animal means an organism (other than a Human Being) that is not a plant and includes eggs and semen. For example, cats, dogs, birds, stock, poultry etc

Birds: Birds means all birds other than special birds, poultry, roosters and racing pigeons

Animal	Circumstances in which keeping an animal is prohibited
Dog	 Keeping of one (1) or two (2) dogs on a premises is allowed as long as the dogs are: Microchipped and registered with Council Contained within a proper enclosure on the premises that prevents the dog getting under, over or through the enclosure (including open gates) Not causing amenity (including barking) nuisance Dogs must be securely held on a leash when in public areas Dog poo must be picked up when in a public place Owners are responsible for the behaviour and control of their dog in designated off leash areas Keeping of 3 dogs on a premises will require a permit from Council and this will only be given in exceptional circumstances (eg: elderly parent moving in with a dog) Keeping 4 or more dogs on a premises is prohibited.
Cat	 Keeping up to 3 cats on a premises is allowed if the cats are: adequately identified with owners name, address & phone no. (ie: Microchip or collar) contained within an enclosure on the premises that is 10m from neighbouring premises, prevents the cat escaping from the premises onto the road & has adequate shelter and water not causing unreasonable nuisance
Poultry	 Keeping up to 10 poultry is allowed on a premises if poultry are kept in an enclosure (house or run) which is: 10 metres from a dwelling on an adjoining premises & a place where food is kept, processed or stored and, not within 2 metres of any premises boundary or road. Keeping poultry on a premises that is less than 300 m2 is prohibited Keeping more than 10 poultry in an urban area is prohibited
Rooster	Keeping a rooster on a premises that is in an urban area is prohibited

	A rooster is required to be:
	 contained within an enclosure on the premises that is 10m from neighbouring premises, prevents the roosters escaping from the premises onto the road & has adequate shelter and water kept so it does not causing unreasonable nuisance or become injurious or prejudicial to health Keeping a rooster closer than 50m from a neighbouring dwelling is
	prohibited
Bird	Up to 60 birds may be kept on a premises provided they are:
Stock	 Keeping stock on a premises less than 8,000m2 is prohibited Stables are to be: not located within 10m of a dwelling on adjoining premises or a place used for manufacture, preparation or storage of food (owners domestic kitchen exempted) set back min. 2m from each boundary of premises located min. 20m from any watercourse, well or bore stable floor covered with absorbent soft floor material changed every 6 weeks planning approval compliance maintained in good condition Stock are to be kept as per the Model Code of Practice for the Welfare of Animals
Bees	On premises: Less than 800m2 = bee hives are prohibited 800m2 - 2,000m2 = 1 x hive permitted 2,000m2 - 10,000m2 = 2-8 hives permitted 10,000m2+ = 8+ hives permitted (Planning Approval may apply) Keeping non-native beehives closer than 15m from a neighbouring residence or place of public access is prohibited.

Note: These conditions do not apply to premises where a development approval pertains to the use of premises for animal husbandry
