FACT SHEET BIN PLACEMENT



Did you know...

That your household waste is collected by a rubbish truck fitted with a mechanical arm, operated by a single driver from inside the truck?

For health and safety reasons the driver cannot leave the cabin to correct bin placement. Which means if your kerbside bin <u>is not placed correctly</u> on the day of collection, <u>your bin may not be emptied</u>.

How do I place my bin for collection?

To ensure your kerbside bin is emptied, follow these simple guidelines:

- <u>Bins out prior to 6am</u> and retuned inside you property no later than 24 hrs after collection.
- <u>Free from obstructions</u> do not place your bin/s near large trees, letterboxes, cars, overhanging branches, power lines.
- Place your bin/s <u>o.5m from the kerbside</u>, and <u>1m apart</u> with the handle and wheels facing your house or property.
- <u>Lids closed</u> overloaded bins can cause damage to truck equipment and will NOT be collected if they exceed 6okg in weight.
- No garden waste in the Dry Waste bin (green lid bin).
- <u>No regulated, hazardous waste or large objects</u> are inside your bin/s (e.g. televisions batteries, chemicals, paints, motor oils).
- Do not place rubbish on top or next to your kerbside bin - excess waste can be disposed at appropriate Waste Transfer Station Facility.
- Rural residents please place your bins 1 metre off the sealed road, well clear of traffic.
- Live in a court/ cul-de-sac please take your bins to the nearest straight section of road, where they are easily accessed by the collection vehicles.
