WASTE FEES AND CHARGES

As of 1 July 2023, charges for domestic dry and wet waste will be in place at Council's Waste Transfer Stations in a bid to curb the region's waste to landfill.

The new charges aim to reduce the amount of waste going into landfill by encouraging residents to consider what they are throwing out to avoid additional costs.

How much will be charged?

Residents will be charged for the disposal of **domestic wet** and dry waste ONLY at Waste Transfer Stations. Where a load is split, users will pay to cover the amount being distributed into either wet or dry waste bins and this will be determined by Transfer Station Attendants.

Domestic Wet and Dry Waste charges outlined below:

Small load = \$8.00 Up to 0.5m3


Example: 2 wheelie bins



Medium load = \$16.00 From 0.5m3 to 2.0m3 Example: small ute



Large load = \$22.00 From 2.0m3 to 4.0m3 **Example: Large Trailer**



What items are free to dispose of?

You can dispose of the following domestic items for **FREE**:

- e-waste
- car batteries
- green waste
- ferrous and non-ferrous metal
- approved/rolled fertiliser bags
- car/motorbike bodies drained (Stoters/Tully only)
- drumMUSTER containers (Stoters/Tully only)
- glass (container refund scheme only)
- plastic (container refund scheme only)
- Reuse Shop products (at staff discretion)
- solar panels
- paint (up to 20 litres)
- engine oil (20 litres)
