# **Extraordinary Disaster Assistance Recovery Grants**

# \$50,000 assistance for small businesses

Extraordinary Disaster Assistance Recovery Grants of up to \$50,000 are available to assist directly impacted small businesses with the costs of clean-up and reinstatement as a result of Tropical Cyclone Jasper.

#### Purpose

6	Purchase equipment and materials to undertake clean up
	Assist with additional labour costs (above and beyond normal wage expenditure i.e. day-to-day staffing)
f.	Dispose of damaged goods and stock, including associated costs
	Recondition or repair essential plant and equipment
	Carry out essential repairs to buildings (other than housing), premises and internal fittings
\$	Purchase or hire/lease costs for equipment essential to the immediate resumption of the business
	Pay for tradespeople to conduct safety inspections



# Application requirements

Photographs of damage

In addition to your completed application form, you will also need to submit the following documents and items as part of your application:



\* Copies of tax invoices or quotes estimates for applications up to \$10,000 (i.e. for immediate resumption of business directly following the disaster event) and for applications over \$10,000 or subsequent applications up to \$40,000 - copies of tax invoices AND evidence that these have been paid (e.g. bank statements, electronic bank confirmations or official receipts)

### Eligibility

To be eligible for the grant you will need to meet the eligibility requirements listed in the Extraordinary Disaster Assistance Recovery Grant guidelines.

### Defined disaster area



The defined disaster area for small businesses under the Tropical Cyclone Jasper disaster event include the following Local Government Areas:

- Cairns Regional Council
- Cassowary Coast Regional Council
- Cook Shire Council

- Hopevale Aboriginal Shire Council
- Mareeba Shire Council
- Tablelands Regional Council
- Wujal Wujal Aboriginal Shire Council
- Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council

#### Other assistance available from QRIDA

In addition to the grant assistance available, low interest loans are also available for eligible small businesses impacted by Tropical Cyclone Jasper.

These loans include:

#### **Disaster Assistance Loans**

These loans of up to \$250,000 help re-establish normal operations by covering costs such as:

- repairing or replacing damaged plant and equipment
- repairing or replacing buildings
- supplying stock for up to one month to replace lost stock and maintain liquidity of the business
- meeting carry-on requirements including:
  - sustenance
  - paying rent and rates

#### Disaster Assistance (Essential Working Capital) Loans

These loans of up to \$100,000 assist with essential working capital expenses such as:

- paying salaries or wages
- paying creditors
- paying rent or rates
- buying goods, including for example, fuel essential to carry on the business.
