Joint statement from Cassowary Coast Regional Council and Cardwell Chamber of Commerce regarding Port Hinchinbrook Development and One Mile Creek

Cassowary Coast Regional Council has joined with the Cardwell Chamber of Commerce and Cardwell stakeholders in advocacy for the Queensland Government to address longstanding matters surrounding One Mile Creek dredging and the former Port Hinchinbrook in Liquidation Development. These matters include:

- Permanent All-Tide Access: A sustainable solution for all-tide and all-weather access through ongoing dredging and maintenance of One Mile Creek in Cardwell.
- 2. Innovative Investment Models: Proactive exploration of new and innovative investment attraction models for the former Port Hinchinbrook Development in Liquidation.

Cassowary Coast Regional Council and the Cardwell Chamber of Commerce extends their gratitude to the State and Federal governments and Members of Parliament including Mr Nick Dametto, Member for Hinchinbrook and Hon Bob Katter, Member for Kennedy for their continued support and funding to date.

However, moving forward there are pressing matters that demand attention regarding the ongoing dredging of One Mile Creek and the future of the former Port Hinchinbrook marina and on-shore facilities.

Council is moving forward with a focus on the short-term option of dredging less than 1,000 tonnes as this will provide improved access whilst we work with the Cardwell stakeholders to advocate to State and Federal governments on long-term solutions for all-tide access in One Mile Creek.

Port Hinchinbrook STP Construction update

Construction of the Port Hinchinbrook Sewerage Treatment Plant is now 50% complete with the project on track to reach completion within budget in August 2024 (pending weather and unforeseen delays).

- Major concrete works have now been completed
- Hydrotesting is complete
- Installation of in-ground services is currently underway
- Coating of concrete tanks is complete
- The major storage tank has been procured and en route from the UK


Hull Heads/Cowley Beach Boat Ramp Update

Tully - Telstra Network Disruption Advice

On behalf of Telstra, Council would like to inform Tully residents of network upgrades that may temporarily impact internet and mobile phone services from Wednesday 20 March to Wednesday 27 March 2024

We are upgrading our mobile network

Telstra Network Disruption Advice

Telstra is upgrading its mobile network at Tully with work to take place over 7 days commencing 20th March 2024. Mobile service will be impacted during this period.

As this upgrade work needs to be carried out during daylight hours for health and safety reasons, our technicians will need to switch off sectors which support mobile services in the area and power to the exchange. This will result in disruption to mobile services in the area. Every effort will be made to reduce the impact to our customers, and we apologise for any inconvenience. These upgrade works will cause disruption to all devices using the Telstra Mobile Network, including mobile handsets, EFTPOS machines, and any device with a Telstra Mobile SIM.

Upgrade work and testing, if all goes according to plan, will be completed by 27th March 2024. Site Outages will be kept to a minimum during that period, and we anticipate launching the improved services as soon as possible.

Thank you for your patience and understanding while we upgrade the network.
