Kerbside recycling coming to the Cassowary Coast

The Cassowary Coast will soon commence best practice waste management with the introduction of a new kerbside recycling collection service to be implemented across the region.

Cassowary Coast Regional Council is looking to transition its current waste separation system with 240L yellow lidded 'recycling' and 140L red lidded 'mixed general waste' bins in the coming 2024/25 financial year.

The announcement follows a Special Meeting held on Thursday 11 April where Council endorsed the CEO to commence negotiations for a new collection and transfer services contract with preferred vendor JJ Richards and Sons from August 2024.

Geraldton Bridge Restoration advances to stage two

Commencing on Monday 8 April, the works will primarily focus on essential bridge maintenance, particularly targeting the expansion joints. This maintenance involves precise attention to the bridge's key structural elements, including the piers and girders, with a critical emphasis on replacing specific arrangements to uphold the bridge's integrity.

The anticipated timeline for this maintenance is approximately three weeks, pending favourable weather conditions and site readiness. To minimise disruption to the local community, work will be conducted at night on Monday to Thursday from 8 to 24 April, 6:00pm to 6:00am. Traffic management measures will be implemented to ensure safe passage for motorists, with the bridge operating under single-lane closure during this period.

Fish frames a dangerous boat ramp feed

Fishers who discard fish frames and bait at boat ramps in Croc Country are attracting crocodiles and putting themselves and the lives of other people at risk.

Wildlife officers from the Department of Environment, Science and Innovation (DESI) have installed three recent crocodile sighting warning signs at the Maria Creek boat ramp at Kurrimine Beach on the Cassowary Coast.

Director Northern Wildlife Operations Lindsay Delzoppo said DESI had received three sighting reports in recent weeks of a three-metre crocodile hanging around the boat ramp and eating discarded fish frames.

Council will be commencing the replacement of the water main along Mars Street to Geddes Street starting on Monday 8 April 2024. This project is estimated to take 6 to 8 weeks, subject to weather conditions.

- Mars/Brannigan Streets intersection
- Geddes Street

Unsealed Road Maintenance

Cassowary Coast Regional Council is responsible for maintaining over 514 km of unsealed roads and has annual budgets of approximately \$1.8 million dedicated to unsealed road re-sheeting and 1.6 million on maintenance grading. Unsealed roads are a highly dynamic asset as the condition of the road can change rapidly due to traffic movement, weather, and variability in terrain. Soil types and gravels also add to the complexity of maintaining unsealed roads.

Council has four grading crews that are used for maintenance grading, re-sheeting, and road reconstruction works. We also regularly hire contractors to supplement our fleet.

Tropical Cyclone Jasper: Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA) in Cassowary Coast

QRA officers are being deployed for the first follow-up damage assessments on properties impacted by disasters over the summer period.

Starting this week, Damage Assessment and Reconstruction Monitoring (DARM) teams will be in the Cassowary Coast door knocking homes and businesses damaged by ex-Tropical Cyclone Jasper.

Officers will check on recovery progress and talk to affected residents to collect information on property damage, repairs, insurance matters, and residents' ability to access financial and personal support where required.

The data captured will be shared with local councils and government agencies to provide ongoing support where possible and inform planning for future disasters and current advocacy needs.


