

LOCATION: Junction of the North Johnstone River and South Johnstone River, Innisfail (off Fitzgerald Esplanade near Edith Street intersection)

LENGTH: 18m WIDTH: 13.8m DECK AREA: 150m²

FEATURES: Completed in January 2016, Innisfail Commercial Wharf is larger and stronger than its predecessor, with a 16m berth area for large vessels, fixed stairs for smaller vessels, lighting, power, water & the same service level, regarding depth of water as the previous wharf. A bunded area for refueling is also provided for use by approved permit holders and the deck has the capacity to carry a 44 tonne GCM truck or equivalent.

USAGE: Designed for commercial and recreational vessels up to 20m in length. Survey undertaken in 2006 shows bathymetry at the wharf between -2.0 m to -3.0 m LAT. Wharf users should seek local knowledge regarding tides and water depth in the Johnstone River.

Users must manage the risk associated with a tidal wharf of a fixed height when it comes to loading and unloading processes, particularly with respect to passengers. Maximum berthing time is 15 minutes unless otherwise approved by permit.

The distance between the outer side of the fender piles & the concrete wharf structure is 740mm. Operators are responsible for providing gang planks for loading and unloading goods from their vessels.

Users must manage the risk associated with a tidal wharf of a fixed height when it comes to loading and unloading processes, particularly with respect to passengers. Consideration should be given to the use of an appropriate gangway for loading and unloading operations. Maximum berthing time is 15 minutes unless otherwise approved by permit.

MAXIMUM VESSEL SIZE: LOA 20m, Displacement 80 tonnes

END OF WHARF: 17° 31′ 28″ S 146° 1′ 59″ E (WGS 84)

WHARF LEVEL: Fixed height of 2.56m AHD (approx. 3.52m above LAT)

No commercial use or refuelling without a permit from Council. No diving or swimming from wharf. Fishing lines and nets are to be retrieved while vessels are berthing.
